## 5.2 The El Dorado County Office of Education Annual Review of the Black Oak Mine Unified School District's 2019-20 LCAP Discussion

EXPLANATION: The EI Dorado County Office of Education's Annual Review of Black Oak Mine Unified School District's 2019-20 LCAP has been approved. As part of the Local Control Funding Formula and to establish accountability with former Governor Brown's subsidiarity approach to funding education in California, the Local Control Accountability Plan was created to provide transparency and accountability as to how Supplemental and Concentration Grant funds were utilized by school districts to meet the needs of disadvantaged students. Pursuant to Education Code Sections 52070 and 42127, El Dorado County Office of Education reviews the District's LCAP, provides feedback, and makes recommended suggestions form compliance. This final LCAP incorporates the recommendations from EDCOE which were minor edits.

## 6.2 ACTION: Resolution #2019-13 Sufficiency or Insufficiency of Textbooks & Instructional Materials for the 2019-20 School Year

<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> It is recommended that the Board of Trustees adopt Board Resolution #2019-13, Determination of the Sufficiency of Textbooks and Instructional Materials for the 2019-20 school year.

<u>BACKGROUND:</u> Pursuant to Education Code Section 60119, the Board of Trustees will hold a public hearing on or before the eighth week of school. Notice of the public hearing was posted in three public places within the District and stated the time, place and purpose for the hearing 10 days prior to the hearing.

The definition of "sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" means that each pupil has a textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home to complete required homework assignments. It does not mean that the district must have two sets of textbooks for each student. The textbooks or instructional materials, or both, are aligned to the content standards.

#### 6.3 ACTION: Facilities Master Plan

<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> District Staff and JK Architecture Engineering will present the Black Oak Mine USD 2019-2030 Facilities Master Plan and request approval of the plan as presented. It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the Black Oak Mine USD 2019-2030 Facilities Master Plan as presented.

<u>BACKGROUND:</u> JKE Architecture was selected to perform a comprehensive review of the District's facilities as part of the Black Oak Mine USD 20192030 Facilities Master Plan. Since January, JKE Architecture has been engaged with our educational community in developing the Black Oak Mine USD 2019-2030 Facilities Master Plan, a vision for our school facilities looking into the future.

The facilities master plan process involved students, parents, community members, classified staff, certificated staff, administrators, and the Board. In addition, site visits were conducted and a full inventory of the District's facilities, age of buildings and infrastructure was developed in order to establish the current conditions that exist in the District.

Moreover, the Facilities Master Plan is a snapshot of the District's facilities as of 2019 and provides today's vision for the maintenance and improvement of facilities in the District over the next decade. Likewise, the Facilities Master Plan is also intended to be a living document that can be adjusted and amended as the priorities and needs of the District change. Therefore, this plan should be regularly reviewed for progress and updated as the needs and ability to finance identified projects becomes more defined.

6.4 ACTION: Consideration of Adoption of Resolution #2019-18 Ordering an Election to Authorize

#### Issuance of School Bonds (Not SB268)

<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> District staff recommends the Board of Trustees adopt Resolution No. 2019-18 Ordering an Election to Authorize Issuance of School Bonds (Not SB268) as presented.

<u>BACKGROUND:</u> Black Oak Mine Unified School District educates nearly 1,300 students in four elementary schools, one comprehensive junior-senior high school and one alternative school in rural El Dorado County. Through the facilities master planning process, the District has identified significant facility needs, repairs and necessary improvements including leaky roofs, outdated plumbing, air conditioning, electrical upgrades, lighting, and various health and safety related facility projects in the District.

Resolution 2019-18 asks voters to authorize the District to issue and sell bonds up to \$29,868,000 and use the bond proceeds to make the necessary facility improvements identified in Appendix A of the resolution. The measure will require approval by at least 55 percent of the registered voters voting on the measure. An independent Citizen's Oversight Committee will be established upon passage to ensure bond proceeds are expended on the types of projects listed on the Bond Project List (Appendix A). Likewise, proceeds will only be used for the construction, rehabilitation, or replacement of school facilities, including the furnishing and equipping of school facilities, and the acquisition or lease of school facilities, and not for any other purpose, including teacher and administrator salaries and other school operating expenses.

In addition, the following are other benefits positive impacts of investing in District facilities:

- Better learning environment for local students Good schools contribute to increased community safety, higher property values, and provide education and job training for tomorrow's community members.
- Leveraging State Facility Funds The State of California provides matching funds to school district for facility improvements on eligible facilities. This match can be as high as 60% under the current State School Facility program and may be as high as 65% under proposed legislation. Districts who do not take advantage of this program lose out on this resource and the funds go to other districts who do participate.
- Increased Property Values Better schools increase property values and make purchasing a home in the District more attractive to buyers.
- Business Investment Businesses are more likely to invest in communities with strong schools.
- Economic boost By law, funds from the proposed measure must be spent on local school facility improvements, thus creating additional jobs and boosting the area economy.
- Keeping money in the classrooms Energy efficiency improvements (windows, HVAC, solar, etc.) and critical facility repairs that can be paid for by a G.O. bond will provide more funding for instruction.
- Taxpayer safeguards are in place Funds raised cannot be taken by the State and must be spent locally; in addition, expenditures must be annually reviewed by an independent citizens' oversight committee.
