7. INFORMATION AND DISCUSSION

7.1 Second Interim Letter from the El Dorado County Office of Education

<u>EXPLAINATION</u>: The El Dorado County Office of Education has reviewed Black Oak Mine Unified School District's 2019-20 Second Interim Report and confirmed the District's "Positive Certification" in the current and subsequent fiscal years.

<u>BACKGROUND:</u> In compliance with the provisions of Education Code Section 42130 et seq., the El Dorado County Office of Education has completed its review of our District's 2019-20 Second Interim budget which was approved by the Board of Trustees at the March 28, 2020 Board meeting. This review covers the 2019-20 Second Interim budget as well as the projections for 2020-21 and 2021-22. The County Office is required to issue a letter to the Governing Board by April 15, 2020, that indicates agreement (or disagreement) with the District's finding of positive, qualified or negative budget.

7.2 COVID-19 Updates

<u>EXPLANATION</u>: A follow up report on the latest COVID-19 information pertaining to Educational Institutions will be discussed and a report on the District's Distance Learning initiatives.

<u>BACKGROUND:</u> Due to the coronavirus, effective March 16, 2020, the district closed schools on recommendation from the county Public Health Department. The district implanted distance learning that same week in effort in continue education for students.

7.3 2020-21 Draft Budget

<u>EXPLANATION:</u> Sid Albaugh, the Chief Business Official for Black Oak Mine Unified School District will update the Board of Trustees on the 2020-21 DRAFT Budget proposal. Mr. Albaugh will discuss the assumptions used to develop budget and the underlying economic conditions upon which the budget will be adopted in June.

BACKGROUND: Every January, the Governor of California presents the proposed budget for the State of California. In January of 2020, the proposal was based on an economy running on all cylinders with unemployment at historical lows, the stock market at all-time highs, property values increasing, and State reserves that we had not seen since the 1970's or before. Three months later, due to the COVID-19 health and economic crisis, the State is projecting a budget deficit of \$54 billion of which K-12 education will incur an \$18 billion hit in 2020-21. That said, District staff will present a draft budget proposal to the Board of Trustees that allows the District to adopt a budget as it is must do by statute, knowing that budget adjustments will need to be made in the fall when more data becomes available.

8. NEW BUSINESS

8.1 Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators

<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> It is recommended that the Board of Trustees consider taking action to adopt the Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators for the 2020-21 school year.

BACKGROUND: In the 1994-95 school year legislative changes were made in the waiver process for Emergency Teaching Permits and Credentials. Due to these changes a Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators must be adopted each year by the Board of Trustees at a regularly scheduled meeting if any Emergency permitted teachers are hired in the District. The El Dorado County Office of Education has notified us that teachers with English Learning students in their classroom need CLAD certification to clear the monitoring process. The County Office of Education will submit the declaration to the Commission on Teacher Credentialing. The Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators represents a statement of need for the 2020-21 school year. This Declaration shall remain in force until June 30, 2021.

8.2 Resolution #2020-09 - Biennial Resolution Ordering Governing Board Member Election and Consolidation of Election

<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> It is recommended that the board of trustees consider approving Board Resolution #2020-09 Declaring an Election Be Held.

<u>BACKGROUND:</u> Black Oak Mine Unified School District is declaring an election be held in our jurisdiction consolidating with other districts requesting services. The election will be held on November 3, 2020 for the nomination of two (2) vacant seats for candidates for the Board of Trustees.

8.3 Resolution #2020-10 Temporary Inter-Fund Transfers for 2020-21

<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> It is recommended that the Board of Trustees adopt Resolution #2020-10 Temporary Inter-Fund Transfers for cash flow purposes.

<u>BACKGROUND:</u> As a result of budget challenges, short-term borrowing amongst funds is the most economical way to temporarily meet obligations without costly external borrowing. Education Code Section 42603 allows districts to engage in internal borrowings between funds.

8.4 Resolution #2020-11 - Resolution to Close the Charter School Fund (Fund 09)

<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> Currently, when Black Oak Mine USD students move to the American River Charter School from another BOMUSD school, the General Fund of the District is impacted negatively. By closing the Charter School Fund – Fund 09, the negative impacts of students moving between programs will be eliminated. Likewise, there will be no impacts to the programs of the American River Charter School by closing Fund 09.

<u>BACKGROUND:</u> The American River Charter School was established in 2010 under the authority of the Black Oak Mine Unified School District Board of Trustees. This authority includes acting as the Board of Trustees to the American River Charter School.

When students leave a Black Oak Mine Unified School District school and enroll in one of the American River Charter School programs, the change in enrollment negatively impacts the District's General Fund – Fund 01 and positively impacts the Charter School Fund – Fund 09. However, by closing the Charter School Fund – Fund 09 and including the American River Charter School programs in the General Fund – Fund 01, the negative impact to the General Fund – Fund 01 of a student moving between the programs will be eliminated.

There will be no impact to the programs of the American River Charter School from closing the Charter School Fund – Fund 09.

District staff recommends the Board of Trustees adopt Resolution #2020-11, Closure of the Charter School Fund – Fund 09, as presented.

8.5 Resolution #2020-12 Tax Revenue Anticipation Note (TRAN) - Participation in the CSBA California School Cash Reserve Program

<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> It is recommended that the Resolution for Tax Revenue Anticipation Note (TRAN) – Participation in the CSBA California School Cash Reserve Program be adopted as presented.

<u>BACKGROUND:</u> During this period of economic uncertainty, it is prudent for the District to prepare for potential short term cash flow issues due to deferred revenues and delayed property tax disbursements. To ensure the District is able to meet current obligations throughout the fiscal year, participating in the CSBA California School Cash Reserve Program allows the District to borrow funds (up to \$2,000,000) at a nominal rate (1%) and repay these funds by year end when the tax revenues have been received by the District. Likewise, the District may then draw from these funds should the District's cash position be a concern.

The Fiscal Crisis Management Assistance Team (FCMAT) recommends issuing a TRAN as a best practice during times when generally reliable revenue streams may be delayed. In addition, School districts, community college districts and county boards of education are authorized by Sections 53850 to 53858, both inclusive, of the California Government Code (the "Act") (being Article 7.6, Chapter 4, Part 1, Division 2, Title 5 of the Government Code) to borrow money by the issuance of temporary notes.

9.2 Carl Perkins Vocational Education Application for Funding

<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the submission of the proposed Carl Perkins Vocational Education application for funding for the 2020-21 school year.

<u>BACKGROUND:</u> The Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Improvement Act of 2006, is administered by the California Department of Education. The Board must annually approve the submission of the application. The 2019-20 allocation of \$8,044.00 is to be utilized at Golden Sierra High School following all applicable state and federal rules and regulations. The funding will provide technology upgrades, supplies and materials, professional development and training, and curriculum development. Principal, Jeremy Meyers will administer the grant.
